CITY LIGHTS PRESENTS AN UNFLINCHING, WITTY LOOK AT MODERN GENDER POLITICS WITH RAPTURE, BLISTER, BURN

Gina Gionfriddo's smart script asks: "What if you had a chance at the road not taken?"

"What if you wake up one day and decide ... my books don't love me, my degrees and awards don't love me, the 500 men I've had sex with don't love me ..." -Gwen

SAN JOSE, CA (April 25, 2017) – Catherine wants what her friend Gwen has: a husband and children. Maybe. Gwen wants to be what Catherine is: a famous academic and cultural pundit.

Toss in Catherine's widowed but feisty mother Alice, a young reality-TV maker, Gwen's flawed husband, feminist theory and lots of martinis, and you have the makings of *Rapture*, *Blister*, *Burn*: an unflinching, witty look at modern gender politics and the pain and frustrations we go through to find happiness.

Written by Gina Gionfriddo, who was a 2009 Pulitzer Prize finalist for the sharp comedy *Becky Shaw*, *Rapture, Blister, Burn* runs May 18-June 18 at City Lights Theater Company, directed by Virginia Drake. Performances are at 529 S. Second St. in San Jose, Thursday-Saturday at 8 p.m. and Sundays at 2. For details and tickets, go to **cltc.org** or call 408-295-4200.

Rapture, Blister, Burn premiered in 2012 at Playwrights Horizons in New York and was named a New York Times Critics' Pick. The Times called the play "intensely smart and immensely funny," with the New York Daily News pronouncing it "a smart, funny and lightning-paced look at feminism."

City Lights' nonprofit partner for the show is the nearby Northside Theatre Company. Part of the boxoffice proceeds will go toward helping Northside rebound from recent damages caused by the February floods in San Jose.

Virginia Drake (Director), faculty emerita at West Valley College, recently directed *Tigers Be Still* at City Lights, preceded by *Art, The Language Archive, Smell of the Kill, Hedda Gabler, First Day of School* and *August: Osage County*. Her directorial efforts at Los Altos Stage Company include *Who's Afraid of Virginia Woolf, On Golden Pond, Circle Mirror Transformation* and *Doubt.* Virginia has also directed at TheatreWorks and Santa Clara University. A member of Actors' Equity Association, she holds an MFA in Acting from Stanford University, and a BA in Dramatic Art from U.C. Davis. She also records audio books for Books Aloud Inc., based at San Jose's Martin Luther King Library.
